



Opening of the 21st Edition (2017/2018)

The University of Porto officially announces the opening of the 21st edition of the GABBA program – the Doctoral Program in Areas of Basic and Applied Biology (<http://gabba.up.pt>). The first semester, starting in January 2018, will consist of theoretical, practical and laboratorial modules. By the end of the first semester students will start their PhD project, which should last three and a half years. Between the end of the scheduled modules and the start of the PhD projects, the students will be offered the possibility of attending complementary modules, within the scope of the future project.

With the aim of developing higher education that incorporates Medical Science research in Portuguese universities, and being this program at the crossroad between Biology and Health, we hope to attract, additionally to applicants of research-oriented areas, the attention of medical students and graduates of related medical areas wishing to engage in scientific research.

Requirements:

Candidates must hold a University degree in any branch of Biological, Biomedical or Natural Sciences. Candidates with First University degree marks lower than 14 (out of 20) or equivalent (< 70%) will not be considered, regardless of the marks obtained for more advanced education (e.g. Masters degree). Candidates should be fluent in English.

The admission process will consist of three steps:

1. Submission of an Application Form available online;
2. Selection of candidates according to the above criteria;
3. Interview of selected candidates.

Applications are submitted, from the 4th until the 22nd of September 2017, via website <http://www.icbas.up.pt/>

Selected candidates will be interviewed, at ICBAS (*Instituto de Ciências Biomédicas Abel Salazar*), between the 2nd and the 4th of October 2017.
